with the balance due **before**, **on and no later than May 15**, **2012**. Registration is on an individual basis, but you must supply a guild membership number. (Available on the back cover of Overtones magazine. Near the mailing label.) Don't delay. You will have to make some choices for classes when registering so get started now! Registration, covers classes (you will have to choose a track) some meals and your hotel room (double occupancy). Music is supplied according to the track you are taking. Bells, tables, and foam will be supplied. No dragging your own equipment! Although if you prefer, you may bring your own bells for the ensemble track if you are coming as a group for those sessions.

Utah Spring Ring - by Terry Waite

The Utah Spring Ring was held on March 10th at Riverton High School in Riverton, Utah, under the direction of Kevin McChesney. There were 264 ringers registered, representing 20 choirs. Eight high school choirs, one junior high school choir and several youth choirs from area churches participated, giving the event a decidedly youthful feel.

All of the choirs came prepared to play the music which allowed Kevin to spend a lot of time working with the choirs on their ringing technique. Many of the directors greatly appreciated the time Kevin spent on controlling the volume and increasing the precision of malleted and martellato passages.

The closing concert was attended by well over 300 people. They were treated to a very moving performance of Cathy Mokelbust's "Beautiful Savior", made possible by Kevin's moving explanation of the story behind the arrangement. "Simple Gifts" and "David's Dance" proved to be a challenge for all of the choirs and a treat for the audience. The program closed with Kevin McChesney's "The Strife is O'er" accompanied by a brass quintet from Bingham High School, their director Darin Graber.



Northern Colorado Festival - by Sue Hahn

Ringers of all ages from Wyoming, Nebraska and Colorado gathered for the Northern Colorado Festival, held at the Mountain View Presbyterian Church in Loveland, Colorado, on Saturday, March 10th. With Paul Gentry as the guest conductor, 147 ringers from 17 choirs had a wonderful day of ringing. Paul currently is the artistic director for the Denver Bronze, an auditioned community ensemble in south metro Denver. Paul has been ringing handbells since he was 9 years old. His mother and her choir from Gering, Nebraska were in attendance.

Mountain View's Joyful Ringers, led by Susan Chapman, were wonderful hosts for the day, rounding up extra chairs, answering questions and giving directions. The youth group from Mountain View served a wonderful BBQ lunch. Over 150 people attended the 4:30 pm concert. Susan Chapman stepped up to the microphone during the concert to play the flute on two pieces. Three choirs rang solo pieces for the concert (Messiah's Ringers from Longmont, Risen Savior Ringers from Broomfield, and the Memorial Handbell Choir from Littleton).

The Natural History Museum of Utah is pleased to be open in our new home, the Rio Tinto Center, to serve as the state's new natural history museum building. Located in the foothills above Salt Lake City, the building is an accomplishment of the community and will serve to further the Museum's mission; to illuminate the natural world and humans place within it. Nestled into the foothills of the Wasatch Mountain Range, the Rio Tinto Center rests on a series of terraces that follow the contours of the hillside, blending into the environment. The building is located along the Bonneville Shoreline Trail, a popular location for hiking and mountain biking, which serves as the Museum's "main street". The building is immediately recognizeable due to the 42,000 square feet of standing seam copper that wraps the exterior of the building. The copper, mined from Kennecott Utah Copper's Bingham Canyon Mine located across the Salt Lake Valley from the new Museum site, is installed in horizontal bands of various heights to represent the layered rock formations seen throughout Utah.

Visitors enter the Level 1 Foyer to purchase admission and register for events. From there, they climb the main staircase, or take an elevator, to emerge in the main lobby area, which we call **the Canyon**. Three-stories high and featuring a **Collections Wall** displaying over 500 objects from the Museum's collection, the Canyon is our central public and gathering space.

From the Canyon, visitors can enjoy **spectacular views** of the Salt Lake Valley, begin to explore the Museum's **Trailhead to Utah** system, enter the exhibit galleries, or enjoy the **Museum Store** and **Cafe**.
