Voting for Area officers is one of the privileges and responsibilities of members of Handbell Musicians of America. Ballots were mailed recently to Area 11 members to vote for a new Area Chair-Elect and Secretary/Treasurer.

Candidates for Chair-Elect were asked to answer the following question by the nominating committee: Handbell Musicians of America -Area 11 is one of the largest geographical territories in Handbell Musicians of America. Area 11 also has one of the smallest membership rosters. How would you go about leading Area 11 and developing Handbell Musicians of America membership - considering our large 5-state area?

Candidates for Area 11 Chair-Elect are **Jeannine Holt** and **Jane Wolfarth**.

Jeannine Holt is a graduate of Baylor University (Bachelor of Music) and has been ringing/directing for 25 years. After directing children, youth and adults in various locations she currently directs the Sanctuary Bells at Village Seven Presbyterian Church in Colorado Springs and a beginner senior women's ensemble that performs in nursing homes and community venues. Jeannine is also the president of the board for the Southern Colorado Handbell Alliance. Her passion is in training and educating Adult Ringers.

Jane Wolfarth discovered handbells when she moved to Utah where she has been a member of Bells of Joyful Sound for seven years. In addition to her own ringing experience she has written pieces for handbells including a presentation for six ringers intended to introduce kids to handbells. She also plays the French Horn in the Salt Lake Symphonic Winds and teaches international students at the University of Utah.

Candidates for Secretary/Treasurer were asked to answer the following question by the nominating committee: Handbell Musicians of America - Area 11 uses computer software and online banking to maintain records. Secretary/Treasurer candidates are Catherine Cmiel, Rick Meurer and Paul Young.

Catherine Cmiel has been involved in Instrumental Music Education since graduating from Northern Illnois University in 1981. She became the Director of Music at Fountain of Life Lutheran School in Tucson in 1996 where she directed the Band, Steel Drum Ensemble, Musicals, Handbell Choir and Chime Choir. Currently she is doing many of the same things at The Academy of Tucson where she is using a set of Chimes provided by the Chime Loan Program to instill a love of Chimes in her students. Catherine is a member of Joyous Bells in Tucson and occasionally subs for Sonoran Bells.

Rick Meurer started in music playing oboe and English horn in high school and college. In January 2007 he and his wife decided to join the handbell choir at church and were immediately smitten with "bell fever". During the past five years they have been busy playing in multiple bell groups, including church, community, community college, participating in Area 11 events and a bell concert tour to Italy. They currently ring with the adult bell choir at La Casa de Cristo Lutheran Church. Rick is a graduate of ASU, where he majored in math and took courses in finance, accounting, marketing and management. He worked for 34 years in the title insurance industry holding various positions including Chief Title Officer. Rick is familiar with Microsoft and Adobe programs and online banking and has been bonded several times.

Paul Young has been playing handbells for about 10 years and has attended several Bay View Week of Handbells Festivals. He is a member of Bells of Joyful Sound and serves as their Treasurer. He has a BS degree in Accounting and is currently employed as a Staff Accountant for Geneva Rock Products. ETIQUETTE FOR EVENTS IN THE TABERNACLE AND CONFERENCE CENTER

Area 11 Chair, Claudette Rothwell, a local resident advises Festival/Conference attendees:
"Women should wear a dress, skirts or dressier pants.
Men should wear nice shirts and pants - no tie required.
While we may consider ourselves as "tourists", we will be given special attention for the Friday concert with reserved seating, etc."

In addition, our Area Chair who lives in Utah and has attended several concerts in the tabernacle has provided the following information:

- Patrons should not bring cameras or audio or video recording devices into the performance halls. Photographs are not permitted during the performance.
- Sunday dress is encouraged.
- Patrons should turn off pagers, cellular phones, and similar electronic devices during the performance.
- Food and beverages are not permitted in performance halls.
- Patrons may not bring packages or backpacks into performance halls.
- The Tabernacle doors will open 60 minutes before the performance start time.
- Ticket holders are requested to be in their seats no later than 15 minutes before the performance begins.
- The length of the performance is approximately 90 minutes.

Please note: Both these sites say that doors are closed 15 minutes before programs begin. So take seriously the advice to be in your seat 15 minutes BEFORE the performance begins.

2012 FESTIVAL LAST MINUTE INFO - ALWAYS POSSIBLE CHANGES. Your Festival Committee is doing their best to get you correct information in a timely fashion. They are handling changes being made daily and sometimes more than daily. Keep checking www.area11.handbellmusicians.org The latest information will be posted there.



Courthouse Station is closest to hotel. We will use the Temple Square Station for events on Temple Square. City Center Station (or Temple Square Station) would be used for the new City Creek Shopping Center. Planetarium Station or Arena Station is for another shopping center - the Gateway.

Public transportation is EASY in Salt Lake City. The Little America Hotel is located at the south end of the "Free Zone." The "Courthouse Station" TRAX stop is right outside the door! (Bottom of the map.) Just hop on TRAX to visit City Center, the "BRAND NEW" City Creek Shopping Center, The Gateway and other popular sites for dining and shopping in Salt Lake City.

FESTIVAL REGISTRATION and HOTEL CHECK-IN (In that order!)

You must complete the Festival Registration process **BEFORE** checking in to your hotel room. **Festival Registration opens at 11am (Thursday, June 21)** – on the first floor of The Little America Hotel.
