Two Area 11 Chime Loan Recipients Share Their Stories

Mariska Romney in Ogden, Utah and Marianne Cook in Chandler, Arizona have had wonderful experiences during the past school year as they used their set of Area Chimes that were loaned to them through our Chime Loan Program. Read their stories below.

Mariska Romney: My elementary students here at DaVinci Academy in Ogden have loved using the tone chimes. I first introduced them to my 5th/6th graders in November. They were very excited. Every week for music class we played on the tone chimes and in December they learned some easy Christmas carols. The 3rd/4th graders were putting on a Christmas play and I had a couple of kids play the tone chimes as chords on two of their songs. At the performance you could tell by watching their faces how much they enjoyed playing the chimes. I spent three classes teaching the 3rd/4th graders the chimes after that so everyone would get a chance to play. I think the tone chimes are a great instrument to teach to children because it is very easy to play and they get to be involved in making music together as a group. My 5th/6th graders really missed playing them and asked if we could form an after school group. Here is a picture of our group that meets once a week just to play for fun.

Marianne Cook: The handchime ensemble at BASIS Chandler is having a great inaugural year! The students are reading music and working on 2 pieces to perform at our spring concert in April. They will also be playing on one of their choir songs. We have been having a good musical experience learning about the different octaves in music, how to read rhythm, when they play their chime. It has reinforced all the music theory we have been studying this year.

The ensemble is made up of 5th grade music students and meets 3 times a week. They perform as a choir as well as handchimes so we make the most of our rehearsal time. I feel the handchimes have made the music theory lessons come to life in terms of applying what we are learning to playing a musical instrument. I have seen the students understanding of musical symbols progress at a faster pace since we have been working with the chimes. Most of all, the students really enjoy it when they master a piece and can hear the music. Thank you for allowing BASIS Chandler to work with the handchimes this year.

Handbell Musicians of America Area 11 owns several 3 Octave sets of handchimes which are available for loan for a full school year to use in school or church music programs in Arizona, Colorado, New Mexico, Utah, or Wyoming. Sets are loaned with accompanying curricula and Handbell Musicians of America Area 11 will supply a mentor upon request.
