## Meet our clinicians ~ Marilyn Lake and Bonnie Tranby

Marilyn Lake is an elementary music educator in the Shawnee Mission School District, located in the metro Kansas City area. She teaches private piano and preschool music, and directs two church handbell choirs as well as the Heartland Ringers, a community handbell choir. She also directs the only hand chime choir in the Shawnee Mission School District, made up of 5th and 6th grade musicians. Marilyn has degrees in Music Education and Music Therapy from the University of Kansas and a Masters in Music Education from Emporia State University. She is also certified Level One World Drumming and for the last 5 years has combined World Drumming with handbells, hauling her drums from Oregon to Arkansas and everywhere in between!

Marilyn was born and raised in Texas, mostly in the Dallas area. College took her to Kansas, where she founded several handbell choirs, and later one in California. Her talent is in building graded programs that feed on great music and great fellowship. She has two adult children, a husband of 33 years, and a spoiled Boston Terrier. In addition to ringing bells for over forty years, playing the piano and singing, she enjoys KU Basketball, quilting, reading, cooking and gardening.





Bonnie Tranby has been ringing handbells since 1986. She has been ringing with Twin Cities Bronze, one of Minnesota's premier performing ensembles, since 2004 and was recently named Associate Director. She has taught classes in bass bells, treble bells, bell trees and processionals, working with young ringers, and rhythm at the local and national level. She rings with her church choir at Mount Calvary Lutheran Church in Eagan, MN. She directs three youth choirs at Shepherd of the Valley Lutheran Church in Apple Valley. Bonnie has started a handbell program at Edward Neill Elementary in Burnsville where she has been teaching music since 1999. She was chosen teacher of the year at her school by her fellow teachers in 2014. Bonnie earned her music education degree from North Dakota State University (go Bison!) in Fargo, ND and her masters' degree in Educational Leadership from Southwest Minnesota State University. She is looking forward to working with participants in Area 11's Young Ringers' Camp this summer!

#### **Arizona**

Doug Benton, composer, arranger, and clinician....and living in our backyard (Gold Canyon, AZ), came to Sun City on Saturday, October 11 and worked with a group of 55 ringers from all over the state of Arizona, some as far away as Flagstaff. We worked on techniques and rhythms during our Complex Rhythms Made Easy and Synchronizing Techniques workshop. One of the key phrases we all came away with is:



"If I count, I will get it; if I don't, I won't — it's true!" We also learned the physics of the bell sound. Some of our ringers were "old hats" at the game and some were brand new....and all had a wonderful experience and learned new ideas. It was really interesting to learn from a person who knows handbells from the very beginning of the art in the United States. He emphasized that we are musicians, not just ringers and that we are a visual art along with an auditory art. I left the workshop inspired and excited. I would encourage all ringers to participate in ANYTHING that comes your way!

#### Colorado

Forty people attended a workshop entitled **Fine Tuning Your Skills for a More Musical Performance** in Englewood, CO on October 3-4<sup>th</sup> with Michael Joy as the clinician.



Saturday's class was **What You See is What You Get!** This class was not about movement, just for movement sake, but was about how movement can impact the musicality of

the piece. Michael introduced some simple language and concepts that made a huge impact on how a piece sounded.

As an instructor, Michael was very engaging and was good at adjusting the class based on what the ringers wanted. There were beginning ringers as well as very advanced ringers in the class. He was able to make the class relevant to everyone.

#### Comments from attendees:

I thoroughly enjoyed the Saturday workshop. The class emphasized the feeling behind the music, and how to interpret it in a musical way, with all that it implies. Michael Joy brought out new information that we don't usually get. This was not based on learning new techniques, but on getting to the heart of it all—the music itself. I loved it!

I found his material enlightening and have already used his suggestions at my church choir handbell rehearsal. His different use of vocabulary to describe movements helped me to think of movement in a different way - easier than before hearing his unique use of words. It also helped the newer ringers in my church group look better when ringing. After the warm-up session with me prior to the rehearsal, the director also noticed that the ringers were doing things like they should - without his reminding them. So, it was a huge benefit to me and the church group I'm in.
