Festival Reminders:

We have two options for registration.

Option 1: Mail-in registration form and pay a deposit by check, with the balance due later

Option 2: Register online and pay with a credit card.

Registration fee (deadline is March 15, 2018) – \$350.00 *If registering online with credit card, processing fees will apply.*

Late Registration (between March 16, 2018-May 1, 2018) – \$450.00 *If registering online with credit card, processing fees will apply.*



Lodging is NOT included in this registration fee. You will need to contact the hotel to make reservations. Embassy Suites Hotel is offering a special rate to those attending our Festival.

Registrants who live outside a 60 mile radius from the hotel and choose *not* to stay at the Embassy Suites Hotel must pay an Off-site lodging surcharge of \$100.00. This helps insure we meet our contracted room blocks, keeping all costs as low as possible.

If you are unable to attend the full festival, but would like to attend on Saturday, we do have a Saturday Only Option for registration on our website.

CHIME Loan Applications

Handbell Musicians of America Area 11 owns several 3 Octave sets of handchimes which are available for loan for a full school year to use in school or church music programs in Arizona, Colorado, New Mexico, Utah or Wyoming. Sets are loaned with accompanying curricula and Handbell Musicians of America Area 11 will supply a mentor upon request.

Teachers around our area have had some wonderful experiences during the time they had use of our loaner handchimes! You could be next and have your own wonderful experience introducing handchimes to children! OR one of your friends who is a teacher or church musician could be a recipient next school year.

Please pass the information along to your friends and neighbors! They do not need to know how to play or teach handchimes to be chosen as a recipient! Area 11 will provide a mentor to help them get started and keep going all throughout the year!

Area 11 2017-2018 CHIME Loan Recipients' Experiences

The students at **Old Mill Elementary School**, in Stansbury Park, Utah, have had many firsts this year—it's their first year in a new school, with new teachers, new peers, new experiences. However, the most unique experience was the opportunity to join the new handchime choir.

Initially, the school had one handchime choir and rehearsals were held twice weekly. Students ranged from 3rd grade to 6th grade. The first day, students quickly entered the music room with excitement and an eagerness easily seen in their eyes. "What were these new and never-seen-before instruments?",

their faces seemed to say. My goal was to teach in a way that the children would come with that same excitement and eagerness each time. We used popular tunes to learn and remember the notes on the grand staff, bounced balls to learn about staying in sync, and even used (and ate!) Oreos to learn the value of notes.

It has been quite noteworthy to see the progress of the children. Initially, progress was slow and I thought improvement would continue on that same gradual plane the entire year. But somewhere in the 2nd month, the students began to progress at a much faster rate—and their confidence boomed as well. They no longer had to concentrate so much on their ringing technique, their notes or their notes' values. We were able to move on to things like dynamics and stopped techniques such as echoes and finger damping, which the children love.

In December, the choir had their first concerts. The first two concerts were held at the school—One was an assembly for all the students and faculty, the other was held in the evening for family and friends to attend. The concert comprised of all the school's choirs, both vocal and the new chime choir. The noise level at these concerts were typical. A constant buzz of chatter could be heard, that is, until it was chime choir's turn. When the ringers began ringing, the crowd hushed and the children watched their fellow peers with wonder and curiosity. The cheering afterwards was genuine, the students and faculty was amazed by the students and this instrument! The chime choir also was able to perform at a local nursing home. The residents lit up when the children performed, and the children enjoyed bringing delight to the residents. It was fun to see the children lose inhibition and gain the love of performing.

Since then, other students and parents have asked that a 2nd choir be made available. And so due to popular demand, an additional chime choir has since begun.

I asked the students what was their favorite thing about ringing chimes and they said things like,

"I like that when we play all together, we make songs." "My brain has to concentrate real hard, but I like what I can do when I'm ringing." "I like ringing songs that are familiar to me." "I get to do music with my friends!"

All the kids agreed, they love this new experience of ringing handchimes.



As the director, I can see that the handchime choir has added to the children's overall confidence. They love the aspect of making music collectively, and the physicality/movement of making music through handchimes.

Area 11 2017-2018 CHIME Loan Recipients' Experiences

The **Jubilate Performing Arts** program at Christ Anglican Church in Carefree, Arizona has been using chimes that were loaned by the Area 11 Chime Loan program for this last school year, beginning in September of 2017.

Our children range in ages five through sixteen at Jubilate Performing Arts. We teach violin, viola, cello, and music theory on Saturdays throughout the school year, with 26 students in our string orchestra. We thought that a chime choir would be an interesting class to add to our curriculum, and that there would be tons of interest among our current students and children in the community. Sadly, only one student signed up for the class, and he was unable to attend consistently. At that point we changed tactics, adding the chimes to the Loft Choir which is a choir for teens and pre-teens at Christ Anglican Church.





The addition of chimes turned out to be quite helpful for this choir. Where a choir member was still learning to match pitch, the addition of a chime that sounded their predominant tone helped them to stay in tune. Choir members who have been too shy to sing were able to sound chimes instead of singing. All of our choir members have now become very comfortable, and sing with confidence. I do believe the work with chimes helped them overcome considerable anxiety.

We are now looking to purchase a set of chimes for both Christ Anglican Church, and the Jubilate Performing Arts program. I can't imagine our choir without them. Chimes create an ethereal, beautiful quality that is simple to achieve, yet sounds sophisticated and enhances the music considerably. With the constant challenge to find music that is interesting yet simple enough for a children's choir, adding chimes becomes a very agreeable solution. I am certain that interest for a chime choir will surface in the very near future at Jubilate Performing Arts. As in music education in general, getting the word out as to what is available is key to keeping our music programs thriving.
