Because of the fees PayPal charges, the cost is slightly higher to pay with a credit card. If you want to write a check and send that in, you are welcome to do that too. We hope this expedites registration for everyone. If you have feedback about this process, we'd love to hear it.

Your first opportunity to try this will be with the registration for Super Bell Saturday, which will be Feb. 1, 2020. We have locations around the Area and if you haven't been before, it's a chance for us to all get together at the same time and sight-read music, which is then available for purchase. It's just a great time to socialize, make music, practice sight reading, and ring more bells! We try to have a mix of different kinds and levels of music so that there is something for everyone.

Some of you may remember our fundraiser for the youth in September. I am happy to report that we raised \$630 to go toward Young Ringers Camp in 2021. Thanks to everyone who donated! 


Lodging is NOT included in this registration fee. You will need to contact the hotel to make reservations. Doubletree by Hilton Tempe is offering a special rate to those attending our Festival.

Registrants who live outside a 50 mile radius from the hotel and choose not to stay at the Doubletree by Hilton must pay an Off-site lodging surcharge of \$100.00. This helps insure we meet our contracted room blocks, keeping all costs as low as possible.

Accepting Nominations for the Area 11 Ring of Fame Award

The Area 11 2002-2004 Board established the Ring of Fame for those who have made outstanding contributions to the art of Handbell/Handchime ringing.

Area 1

Fing of Forme

Area 11 Ring of Fame recognizes exceptional service and commitment to handbell/handchime ringing in general.

Service and commitment may include:

- •Contributions as an Area 11 or Sub-Area elected officer.
- Subel Musicians •Volunteer work accomplished at Area 11 or Sub-Area level
- •Achievement of National recognition for contributions
- to Handbell Musicians of America, Inc.
- •Development of materials or methods specific to handbells/handchimes.
- •Extended teaching/conducting that has raised the musical standards for ringing.
- •Compositions for handbells/handchimes.
- •Efforts to expand the art of handbell/handchime ringing into new areas Educational, Community, Church, or other populations.

The Area 11 Ring of Fame is awarded every two (2) years at the Area 11 Festival/Conference.

There may be no more than four (4) recipients per festival. The award may be presented posthumously.

Qualifications for Ring of Fame Nominees:

•The candidate should be a current member of Handbell Musicians of America, Inc. However, exceptions may

be approved by the Area 11 Board of Directors.

•The candidate must have made significant contributions in one or more of the areas listed above.

Area 11 Spring Ring 2020 Clinicians

Northern Colorado Handbell Festival, March 14, 2020



Brenda E. Austin is a dynamic and energetic conductor, clinician and composer. She has served as the Artistic Director for the Detroit Handbell 2016. Under her baton, DHE was honored to open the Handbell Musicians of America National Seminar in 2018. In 2019, Brenda joined the team at Hope Publishing Company in Carol Stream, IL as Editor in charge of the Handbell Catalogue. Additionally, she has served First United Methodist Church in Eaton Rapids, MI, as Director of Worship and Music since 2003. She is also active in the community directing Children's musical theatre and handbell choirs of all levels. Brenda graduated with degrees in Vocal Performance from Western Michigan University and a Master of Music in Choral Conducting from the University of Missouri – Kansas City. She has studied with Craig Arnold, Steve Zegree and Eph Ehly. Brenda is in demand as a handbell clinician throughout the year and has been the conductor and clinician at numerous festivals and workshops including HMA National

Seminar and the AREA 5 Spring Festival. Additionally, she has had more than 50 titles published for handbells since 2014.



Utah Spring Ring, March 14, 2020

Stephanie Rhoades earned her BA in Music from Yale University and then immediately came to Dallas to attend Southern Methodist University where she received her Master of Sacred Music degree with a concentration in Choral conducting.

She served as Director of Music at First United Methodist Church of Coppell for six years, directing both vocal and handbell choirs for adults, youth and children. She then served as Associate Director of music at Grace Presbyterian Church in Plano for five years, working primarily with children

and youth handbell choirs and children's vocal choirs.

She began playing the violin and trumpet at an early age and then learned to play the piano and handbells in addition to her choral training. Stephanie has been a guest clinician and handbell festival conductor for

events from Las Vegas, Nevada to Montreat, North Carolina. Her leadership experience includes serving as President of the Dallas Chapter of Choristers Guild, President of the Greater Dallas Handbell Association, and chair of Area IX of the American Guild of English Handbell Ringers.



She has taught 1st & 2nd grade music at Parish Episcopal School for five years. In addition to teaching, she conducts an auditioned community handbell ensemble, Concert Bells of Fort Worth. She loves learning almost as much as she loves teaching, and has a passion for sharing her knowledge and enthusiasm with others.

Wyoming Spring Ring, April 17-18, 2020

Michael J. Glasgow owns a LOT of black clothing. His work is legendary in church music, advertising, and supermarket-food-demonstrations (it was a dark time for him, but little old ladies still talk about his pioneer efforts with cutting-edge bagged salad).

In addition to his work at North Raleigh UMC, Michael is the Bass Section Leader for the NC Master Chorale. Heralded for his "abundant melodic gift" (New York Concert Review), Michael is an award-winning composer of organ, handbell and choral works, and keeps busy with commissions (as well as pet projects that will never sell, but which he enjoys).

Michael made his Carnegie Hall debut conducting his *Requiem* for chorus and orchestra in June 2017, and conducted its European premiere in Vienna two years later. He is proud to have served as the inaugural conductor for the *Anthornis* and *Anthornis North* advanced-ringing events in Minneapolis and Fargo; and to have



conducted thrice in England (where they really use the word "thrice"). Additional international engagements include Hong Kong, Singapore, Canada, and on a cruise ship in the Eastern Caribbean.
