



A good example is what is happening in the Alpine area in Utah. Originally a bell choir was started at Lehi Junior High School and as a new teacher Jill Smith came into the established bell choir in 2013 more bells were added to

have a 5 octave-set. Then with her support, bells were added to the Lehi High School program. From there as the High School was divided, Skyridge High School with teacher Kirsten Richards purchased some bells and started a class.
